Winter and those cold dark nights, the days are so short and not much time to get out and enjoy ourselves with NINA and their fun activities. Picton tour at the end of April, was a wet day and instead of sitting at home and watching the weather, a group of clients went on the Picton tour. Not one person on the tour said, 'I wished I stayed home. Read their stories in our newsletter. Also, have a look at our outings coming up in the next 2 months, we love to see you on these.

There are changes coming in the My Aged Care world from 1 July 2025. Though it won't be changing much for clients under the Commonwealth Support Home Program (CHSP), more legalities for providers. If you wish to keep up to date with information. I suggest you follow https://opan.org.au/ which is a service for Older People Advocacy, they provide free, independent and confidential support to older people receiving government-funded aged care. If you don't have internet access, ensure your children follow it and obtain information from it.

Throughout the month NINA's 48 volunteers complete between 400-700 transports, 91-280 meals, 714 hours of social support (numbers approximately). This takes a lot of scheduling, researching, planning and long hours for everything to run smoothly, which is handled by our experienced and diligent staff Mollie, Jaclyn & Alex. We do ask you though that you remember to book your NINA activities including transports, social support and meals in 7 days or more and the later being the best. If you do require an urgent service, that you understand when we have to say no.

Remember it is the volunteers that make this organisation run the way it does, without them it wouldn't. If you know of anyone that can give us 4 plus hours more a month, have them get in touch with us for a chat.



Do you have 10c bottles, cans around your house and wish to donate them to a charity? At the Return and Earn's located in Helensburgh and Bulli, we are listed as one of the charity's you can donate to. To do this, you use the Return and Earn app and

select NINA as the charity. Tell your family and friends. All money raised will go to volunteers expenses.



RIP to Norma Anderson A beloved NINA client

Norma was born on the 21st of July, 1934, in Mudgee.

In fact, she was born on her mother's birthday—what a beautiful gift. She was an only child, deeply loved and cherished by her parents.

Norma was 10 years old then, growing up in the shadows of World War II. One vivid memory she often shared was hiding under the kitchen table, mattress and all, during the Japanese midget submarine attack on Sydney Harbour

in 1942.

Norma left at 15 to begin work—first attending Secretarial College where she learned shorthand and typing. She was always proud of that skill, and she put it to good use.

In the 1950s, Norma found her passion for athletics—high jump, long jump, and the 880 yards. She was proud to represent St George Women's Amateur Athletic Club. Norma also enjoyed playing tennis at Cars Park. It was at tennis, in fact, that she met Roy—on the courts at Wollongong Road in Arncliffe. They married on the 6th of February, 1960, at St George's Church of England in Hurstville. She became Norma Anderson and moved into number 5 Hudson Street, right next door to her mother and father.

She was incredibly crafty. Norma always had a project on the go: raffia purses, macramé plant hangers, basket weaving, beadwork, embroidery, and later quilling and crocheting. For the last 25 years, she lovingly crocheted rugs for every grandchild and close friends. Each one a symbol of care, time, and warmth.

Norma also had a great love of animals—her home was always filled with pets: cats, dogs, guinea pigs, budgies, finches, quails, ducks, turkeys, rabbits, chooks—you name it, she cared for it.

In the 1970s, Norma finally got her driver's license—at the age of 40—with three backseat drivers along for the ride!

Her love of athletics never faded and she was proud to be awarded a Life Membership at St George Women's Amateur Athletic Club.

In the 1980s, Norma remained active in her community—volunteering for Neighborhood Watch, Meals on Wheels, and helped contribute to the writing of the history of her beloved athletics club for the local historical society. She even joined her neighbors in successfully fighting against a brothel being established in the area—she was never one to shy away from what she believed in.

In the 2000s, she said goodbye to the family home at Hudson Street and moved to Caringbah. It was here that Norma cared for Roy's declining health. This was a chapter in both their lives that she took on dutifully without complaining. Her husband, Roy passed away *in 2000*, and though it was another loss, she carried on with strength and grace.



She later moved into a granny flat at Darkes Forest. What began as "grandma living next door". Norma was always engaged with the community where ever she lived and even became a regular at Helensburgh Pony Club events watching her grand-daughter compete. Norma linked up with NINA (Northern Illawarra Neighbour Aid) where she looked forward to meeting up weekly with her friends, going to the club for meals, coffee club, craft days and trips to events in the shire.

Norma had always wanted to make it to 90—and she did, celebrating that milestone surrounded by family and friends. She even recovered from a broken pelvis to be there. That was Norma—resilient and determined. She loved a beer or a stout, had a sweet tooth, and never missed a chance to get up and dance at a family celebration.

A day out in Picton Stories from NINA Clients

An 8am pickup! Good heavens! We are off to Picton for the day!

We travel westward to Picton through the eucalypt forests and through the rolling hills of bush and farmland

When we arrived in Picton we went to the Park and admired the wreaths laid on ANZAC day 5 days before. The railway line to Picton from Sydney came very early to Picton, and mining was an early industry as well as farming. Beautiful old buildings are still standing as well as St. Stephens Anglican Church and its adjoining church yard. Flooding from the local rivers has plagued the town and the church has been flooded and refurbished many times.

We headed out of town to the home of Anthony Horderns, the owner of the once popular retail store.

Picton was home to Highway men who held up many stage coaches who lived out in the surrounding hills. These hills are linked to the Blue Mountains. It took Governor MacQuarrie nine days to travel to the city of Bathurst in 1815. Railway construction began in 1850 as the Blue Mountains and western plains became more productive with food and mining. The railway has changed over the years from a one track viaduct, through tunnels no longer being used. They are now are used for mushroom farming. The railway station now sounds as if it would take a day to visit.

I thoroughly enjoyed my day in Picton and enjoyed my visit and research. Would love another visit.

It was a dull overcast morning, but we were determined to have a good day as we travelled around 60klms to the historical town of Picton. Our first rest stop was the beautiful RSL Memorial gardens where wreaths were still resplendent around the base of the memorial, since Anzac Day.

We were first taken to see the Horden's "While I live I grow" tree. Brent, the tour guide had a strong clear voice, pointing out the many history related houses and areas as Ray, our bus driver maneuvered the bus to Brent's instructions.

Stonequarry creek railway viaduct - what an amazing structure to see, but only if you took the long steep slippery walking path. Looking down on us from the trees lining the creek, were hundreds of bats. Our guide decided the bus was small enough to take on the bumpy track to the Redbank rail tunnel. The tunnel was a little eerie and dark, but a structure worth seeing. It is called the mushroom tunnel by the locals.

We were told of the devastating floods of 2019 when all the shops, hotels, church and cemetery were inundated up to roof tops.

A day out in Picton continued

Wednesday the 30th of April 2025, is an overcast gloomy day. Fiona picks up those in the southern suburbs transporting us to meet up with others from Engadine and Helensburgh.

All aboard we travel in rainy weather to Picton RSL Park for morning tea. Here we meet Brent our on-bus tour guide.

We view the legendary 'Anthony Horton Tree,' a 100-year-old Port Jackson Fig, the Company attached a slogan, 'While I Live I'll Grow'. Unfortunately, what we viewed was not the original tree as it was destroyed by a storm in 1987.

Our next stop is to view the heritage listed Stonequarry Creek Railway viaduct. Completed in 1867, it carries the main southern trains today over this fast-running creek. The picturesque Viaduct features 12.2-meter arches and is eighty-four meters long over the creek bed.





Our next destination was Redbank Range Railway Tunnel, commonly known as Picton Tunnel and later as Mushroom Tunnel, it was opened in February 1867. This was a single-track line accommodating barely the engine and open carriages. It was eventually closed to rail in 1919 when a new deviation line opened. It is 180-metre (590 ft) long.

Arms and ammunition were stored throughout its length, and at times, mustard gas tanks were also stored during World War II. Later, it was used to commercially grow mushrooms.

Our driver Ray expertly maneuvered the bus through the rain soaked, narrow pathway. We all breathed easier when Ray stopped before entering the very dark, narrow, musty smelling subway.

Returning into town to visit the church in Argyl Street, St Marks, devastated by the 2019 floods. Picton was established as Stonequarry in 1841 and was renamed Picton in 1845. It was named for Sir Thomas Picton, a British army officer who died at the Battle of Waterloo.

The conclusion of this interesting and informative tour conducted by Brent, was at the Picton Hotel. We were greeted with the smell of a wood burning fireplace and rich enticing food aromas emitting from the kitchen.

Wonderful day, and a big thank you to NINA organisers, Brent's enterprise, and Picton Hotel for an extremely engaging outing.
